

WEBINAR HANDOUT – THE SUIT OF PENTACLES
Recorded Live on Saturday 21st November 2020



The Suit of Pentacles, Coins or Disks.

The four suits of the tarot are representative of different dimensions and different aspects of our lives. Each suit speaks of a different aspect or series of archetypal experiences that take place in the immediacy of our lives.

Each suit of the minor arcana has 10 cards plus four court cards. In today's webinar we will look at the 10 cards in the suit of Coins.

The suit of pentacles, disks or coins is associated with the element of earth and speaks to us of the practical and physical stuff of our lives with a recognition of our personal capacity for manifestation.

This suit speaks about the areas of our lives that are connected to our physical body, our health and our wealth and the healthy tension between the two. Our homes, our possessions, and our relationship to these as well as money, finances, careers, business and commerce.



The Ace of Pentacles.

The Beginning of some aspect of Manifestation.

- Manifestation
- Abundance
- Possibility
- Good luck
- A burst of new energy available for a new venture
- Ambition for material success
- The actual beginning of a new venture
- A small sum of money becomes available
- Someone who knows how to play/use money

This card can indicate both inner and outer riches and a unity within that creates opportunity for manifestation in real terms.

It can also suggest that the seeker is moving house, or receiving a new job opportunity or promotion.

It can also indicate that money becomes available to the seeker particularly in response to the beginning of a new venture, relationship, or chapter of their life.

In reverse this card can indicate a loss of self-belief.

Opportunity disguised as loss.



Two of Pentacles.

This card heralds the development of a project/venture/situation.

- Developing new skills
- Building experience
- Investment
- Ambition with action
- Renewed Passion in an idea/project/situation
- Don't hold back
- Learn New Skills
- Money makes Money
- Change and Transformation

In reverse, this card can imply that the seeker is fearful of change and is perhaps clinging to the known rather than taking a risk and stepping into possibility.

It can also suggest an inability to invest resources wisely or a misuse of funds and resources.



Three of Pentacles.

This is a card of celebration and implies the completion of the beginning of something new that will require more work but shows real promise.

- An initial completion
- Celebration
- A project/situation shows early promise and early success
- Positive beginnings with further work yet to come
- A creative idea is blossoming and deserves further investment
- This is worthy of perseverance
- Make a commitment
- Your full energy is required to manifest this into reality

In reverse, this card can suggest that the seeker is so focused on the end goal that they cannot celebrate their achievements in the moment.



Four of Pentacles

The four of pentacles suggests that something is either blocked or being held back, often by something that is emotionally fuelled.

- Holding on to something
- Fear of loss
- An inability to share
- The seeker is envious of the potential of others
- The seeker may be being blocked by someone else's jealousy
- The seeker is envious of the next generation

In reverse the four of pentacles suggests that the seeker has released an emotional attachment to something creating a new flow of energy forwards.

A gifted teacher will honour and take a pride in a student's achievements when the student's work goes beyond the parameters of the teacher's own.



Five of Pentacles

The five of pentacles suggests that the seeker is experiencing pessimism and needs to stand back and take stock

- The need to leave a situation
- Loss of self-belief
- Loss of finances
- Loss of belief in the venture/project/situation
- Financial insecurity
- A need to be real about the situation and honest with yourself

In reverse, this card suggests that there can be a reorientation of belief. The seeker is ready to change their attitude and from the inside out change will become possible.



Six of Pentacles.

The six of pentacles for me is like the spirit of Christmas, a mutuality of giving and receiving. The seeker is ready to embrace the gift of giving through kindness, generosity and forgiveness.

- Renewal of faith
- Good fortune
- Good luck
- Generosity
- Forgiveness and moving on
- Success
- Gratitude
- Unexpected gifts/opportunities

In reverse, this card asks, are you giving to the wrong people? Or are you taking too much?



Seven of pentacles

The seven of pentacles suggests the need for a financial decision to be made.

- Financial decisions
- Negotiations
- Compromise
- Take your time to consider your choices
- Weigh things up realistically
- Recognize your potential as well as your realistic limitations

In reverse this card can suggest that the seeker is unable to negotiate or compromise or simply unable to stand back enough to see their choices with clarity.



Eight of Pentacles

The eight of pentacles implies a new venture.

- Investment
- Apprenticeship
- Developing and/or building upon an existing project/situation
- New skills are being learned
- Something is worthy of investment
- A career move or promotion
- A course correction – new skills are needed for development

In reverse this card suggests that the seeker may be a perfectionist and is holding themselves back. It can also indicate various forms of self-sabotaging behavior such as a debilitating inner critic.

It can also indicate someone who is fundamentally lazy and doesn't want to have to do the necessary work to bring a project into fruition.



Nine of Pentacles.

The nine of Pentacles is a card of deep satisfaction. Result!

- Personal achievement and much deserved
- Justifiably pleased
- Self-satisfaction
- You did it!
- Peace and confidence from within
- The past is behind you
- Genuine healthy pride
- A card of promise

In reverse, this card indicates someone who is dependent on external validation due to insecurity. It can indicate the underlying motivation for success lies in ego and unmet needs rather than a calling from the Soul.



Ten of Pentacles.

The ten of cups is a card of wealth, security and happiness.

- Permanence
- Stability
- Financial stability
- Luck
- Love
- Happiness
- You have found your calling/purpose/destiny
- Ongoing contentment
- You have created a legacy that will foster future generations
- Can indicate an inheritance

In reverse this card suggests the passing away of something. It can indicate the loss of finances or property or some other asset, and potential disagreements and/or arguments over a legacy. It can also indicate that the seekers current pathway is NOT their calling.
